


The USA


The USA has struggled in the wake I of the GFC, but the US market as a whole remains resolutely focused on securing work and building their market to be stronger than ever (see our article in issue 137, page 151, on the health of the US builders). Several of the American yards have secured multiple orders over the year, which is a good sign for the prospects of the American market in 2013. With such a huge proportion of superyacht owners being American, focus for the US yards is on converting those American owners back to buying home-produced products. With the America's Cup being held in San Francisco in 2013, a positive impact on the American yachting sector will hopefully be felt.

How do you think the superyacht sector in the USA performed in 2012?

Things picked up a little throughout the US with Palmer Johnson and Broward. Christensen closed four yacht contracts in 2012.

What are your predictions for the USA in 2013?

I think it will get better. We are still getting many inquiries and I imagine the other American yards are getting the same.

What are the USA's key strengths and skillsets or USP?

Being American made is key with American buyers. We are seeing the same with Asian prospects going for American-made products.

Which country do you view as the USA's biggest competitor and why?

The Netherlands, since they have builders of every range and are able to still sell the mystique of Dutch quality.

For an owner looking to build a yacht, why would you recommend a USA yard?

If it's an American buyer

who made their money in America, they should spend their money where they made it. If it's a buyer from another country, as long as the American builder is of 'pedigree' it is a safe bet they will get what they contracted without the risk of destabilised governments and the fact that American laws undisputedly protects a foreign purchaser/ company as equally as the builder in the event of dispute or default by the builder.
